Table of Contents: This section contains information about the Chicago Manual of Style method of formatting and citing documents. These resources follow the 17th edition of the Chicago Manual of Style, published in 2017. The title of a site that is analogous to traditional printed work but that does not have (and has never had) a printed counterpart can be treated as titles of other websites. For example, Wikipedia can be treated as a website, rather than a conventional encyclopedia. This is a difference from previous editions of CMOS. Website titles should follow title-style capitalization and are usually set in Roman without quotation marks. Sections of a website, such as a specific header, a single page, a single blog entry, etc. should be written in Romansh with quotes. There are, however, a few exceptions: blog titles are written in italics and the titles of books, magazines, television programs, films and other types of works should be treated in the same way, regardless of whether they are mentioned on paper or online. For example, when you mention the website of CNN , the title keeps italics. In addition, in cases like this, when a website does not have a distinctive title, it can be cited based on who is responsible for the site, for example CNN online. If you have any questions about use Romanesque or Italic, the Romansh is the safest choice'. Authors for web sources: The author of a part of web content often is not immediately clear. If a name is given, use it as in any other source. If the contents are published with a screen, internet handle or pseudonym, and the real name of author not available, use this instead of the author's name. You can also use the name of publishing when the web page does not have a listed but is associated with some sort of company, association or professional group. When the author of a web page cannot be determined and there is no clear publication simply list the title first. Use the first letter of the first word of the title that is not an article (i.e., "a", "an" or "the") to determine the alphabetical order of the item in the bibliography. So, for example, if the title of the page is "Guide to Cooking Apple Cakes", "G" should be considered the first letter for literacy purposes. Dates for Web Sources: If the cited source has a clear release date, use it as the source date, following standard guidelines. Otherwise, look for a revision date; many websites will note when they were last modified, modified or revised. If you are using a revision date rather than a publication date, please clarify: "Last modified May 17, 2019". You may use both at your discretion, in which case you will need to distinguish between the two: "Published April 26, 2019; last modified May 17, 2019". If no date is available, use the source access date to obtain Data: "Accessed August 7, 2019". If the site is modified again to alter or delete the originally recovered data, you must add a note to that effect in the text or quotation, specifying if possible "as of [date]." See also Periodicals. It should also be borne in mind that while access dates are not required for formally published electronic sources (e.g. journal articles), they may be useful for informally published electronic sources or may be required by some disciplines for all informally and formally published electronic sources. Access dates must be placed immediately before the DOI or URL. For four or more authors, list the first author in the note followed by et al. Ideally, a post should be quoted with the legal name of author and the internet pseudonym/handle, but if there is not an available pseudonym (e.g. on a Facebook post) or no legal name available (e.g. on a Twitter post), use what you have. Also note that it is not necessary to include the format/media if the post is text only, and you should include indication thehour indication only if is relevant to the point or is necessary to distinguish between multiple quotations on the same day. Also, if you have mentioned entire post your main text, you can leave it out of your known quote. N: 2. B: Forums and mailing lists Quotes for internet forums or mailing lists are very similar to quotes on social media, with some differences. Rather than the text of the post, use the thread title or the title of object as the citation title; in addition, the name of the list or forum should be added to the host site or service. Sometimes, you may need to quote a comment that someone made on a blog, an online article, a post on social media, etc. Generally, the comment will be quoted only as a note, not in the bibliography, unless there is some reason so it is felt that it should be considered a source in its own right, separate from the work to which it responded. The citation of a comment must contain only the name the commentator (and/or pseudonym, as above), the date on which the comment was formulated (the timestamp is optional) and a reference to work to which is responding. Online media should be quoted using the general format below. Note that if the title of work is to be written in italics or in Romans with varying quotation marks from one stand to other, as noted at beginning of this page.
